## 9-6-5 Rule

- U.S. visa waiver (VWT or VWB) or U.S. Tourist visa (B-1/2) status while performing activities at the New England Conservatory of Music.
- The activity must last no longer than <u>9 days</u> at any single institution; the individual may have received honoraria from <u>5 or fewer institutions in the last 6 months</u>, but from no more than 5 institutions; the payment relates to service that the international visitor performed for New England Conservatory of Music that is considered to be <u>usual academic activity</u> such as teaching, research, or public service.
