NEC Prep's Chamber Music Intensive Performance Seminar (CHIPS) is led by esteemed cellists and chamber music pedagogues Merry Peckham (NEC Chamber Music Department Chair) and Dr. Laura Blustein (NEC Prep Chamber Music Department Chair). CHIPS offers selected students an immersive opportunity for advanced chamber music study. The objective of the program is to build high level collaborative music-making skills with an emphasis on performance. In addition to receiving weekly faculty coaching and participating in regular performance classes, CHIPS students perform multiple times each year in Guest Artist Masterclasses and are presented in-concert in Jordan Hall.
