



International Student Certification of Finances (COF)

All applicants who are not U.S. citizens and need student visa sponsorship from NEC are required to submit proof of **full funding for at least 1 year** before an I-20 Form (for application to receive an F-1 student visa) will be issued.

The **total amount of support** should equal at minimum the projected expenses for the current academic year:

\$76,987 (USD) for **Bachelor of Music** or **Undergraduate Diploma** students

\$77,506 (USD) for **Master of Music, Graduate Diploma, Artistic Diploma,** or **Doctor of Musical Arts** students

Certification of finances can come from several different sources, including personal or family funds, foundation grants or scholarships, and/or scholarship assistance from NEC. **Verification** (usually in the form of a bank statement) **is required for all funds.**

Please email COF and supporting documentation to the Admissions Office no later than May 15, 2021.
