## **PROGRAM**

Drawing on his recent recording, *From the Dance Hall to the Battlefield*, Jason Moran and student ensembles present music by bandleader, composer and organizer James Reese Europe, including rarely-heard songs written in collaboration with Eubie Blake and Noble Sissle.

After creating the Clef Club, the first organization in New York City supporting African-American musicians, James Reese Europe presented a series of landmark performances in Carnegie Hall starting in 1912. He also collaborated with Vernon and Irene Castle in the popularization of social dance. During World War I, Europe was a lieutenant in the 369th Infantry, known as the Harlem Hellfighters. And the regimental band Europe led during the war was pivotal in introducing jazz-like music to the European continent.
