The Committee meets **the second Wednesday of each month from 9:00-11:30 a.m.** to discuss new course proposals and potential changes to the curriculum.

\_\_\_ **Graduate Curriculum Committee:** This committee is chaired by a Faculty Department chair and attended by the Provost and Dean of the College, the Dean of Students, select faculty and staff members and a graduate student Senator. The Committee meets **the second Wednesday of each month from 9:00-11:30 a.m.** to discuss new course proposals and potential changes to the curriculum.

\_\_\_ **Disciplinary Committee:** This committee is chaired by the Senior Associate Dean of Students and attended by faculty, staff, and Student Senate representatives. The Committee meets on an as-needed basis to determine if a violation of the NEC disciplinary code has occurred, and if so, how to resolve the matter. Violations include academic dishonesty, violation of Residence Hall rules, theft or destruction of property, and harassment of any member of the NEC community.
