SYNOPSIS

Later the Same Evening was inspired by five Edward Hopper paintings: "Room in New York," "Hotel Window," "Hotel Room," "Two on the Aisle" and "Automat." The opera imagines the lives of the figures in these paintings and connects them as characters, both indirectly and tangentially, on a single evening in New York City in 1932.

A young married couple in their apartment avoids the encroaching estrangement in their marriage – she by playing the piano, he by reading the newspaper – before she angrily leaves to see a Broadway musical without him. At the same time in a hotel lobby, a recently widowed older woman nervously awaits her date who will be taking her to a Broadway musical.

In a hotel room, a young woman composes a letter to her boyfriend telling him that she is leaving New York and returning to Indianapolis after a failed career as a dancer. All three women see their lives changing through a window.

Minutes later, these women interact with others in the audience of a Broadway musical: a young man from Lynchburg visiting New York for the first time, an older Jewish couple whose bickering is a form of love, an elegant woman from Italy confounded by the musical and the new country, and a young man who plants an engagement ring on a theatre seat for his girlfriend who happens to be a dancer from Indianapolis. As the houselights dim, the strangers are connected as an audience watching the musical—only to break apart again outside the theatre in the pouring rain.

Later in an automat, the usher from the theatre muses about her work and the excitement of city life. She encounters the young man with the engagement ring and they leave the automat together.

ERICA GUO - Musical Preparation

Chinese-born pianist Erica Xiaoyan Guo has been praised by San Francisco Classical Voice as having "a marvelously flexible touch, the kind of playing that makes you want to hear more..." She has spent over a decade performing internationally as a solo pianist, collaborative pianist, and chamber musician. She has been presented at prestigious institutions such as Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall, the Nymphenburg Palace, Temppeliaukion kirkko, and the Musiikkitalo in Helsinki among others. In 2021 she was an apprentice coach at San Francisco Opera's prestigious Merola Opera Program where she performed in a recital titled What the Heart Desires, as well as in Merola's award-winning film, Back Home: Through the Stage Door, directed by David Paul. She made her Schwabacher Recital Series debut in 2022 in concert with mezzo-soprano Nikola Printz. Since the summer of 2022, Ms. Guo has served on the music staff at Santa Fe Opera and Minnesota Opera. Ms. Guo received her training from the Manhattan School of Music, Hochschule für Musik und Theater München, New England Conservatory of Music, and the University of Maryland. Her teachers include Rita Sloan, Kathleen Kelly, Cameron Stowe, Jonathan Feldman, Antti Siirala, and Solomon Mikowsky. She is also an alumna of the Aspen Music Festival and School and Pittsburgh Festival Opera.

BRETT HODGDON - Musical Preparation

Brett Hodgdon is Head of Music and Chorus Director at Boston Lyric Opera, where he has collaborated with Music Director David Angus on the company's music staff since 2011. Hodgdon serves on the full-time opera and vocal repertoire faculty of the New England Conservatory of Music. Additionally, Hodgdon teaches diction courses at the Boston Conservatory at Berklee. In addition to his work at BLO and as an educator, Hodgdon has been a rehearsal pianist for the Boston Symphony Orchestra and Tanglewood Festival Chorus since 2008, having rehearsed and coached vocal programs for music director Andris Nelsons and many guest conductors, including

performances at Symphony Hall, Tanglewood, and Carnegie Hall. He has also been rehearsal pianist and coach for the Emmanuel Music Bach Cantata Series since 2006. Hodgdon spends his summers as Head of Music at Si Parla, Si Canta! in Arona, Italy and has served on the coaching faculty of the Boston Wagner Institute. He received the D.M.A. in Collaborative Piano from the New England Conservatory and holds degrees from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

JOSHUA MAJOR – Department Chair & Stage Director

Toronto-born Joshua Major began his opera stage directing career at the age of 23 with La Cenerentola for Opera Omaha. Soon after, Mr. Major worked as an assistant at the Welsh National Opera, to Rhoda Levine at Juilliard, and to Cynthia Auerbach at both Chautauqua Opera and the New York City Opera. Mr. Major has worked as a stage director for over 35 years throughout the United States and Canada developing an impressive and diverse repertoire of productions. Recent productions include Norma (Bellini), La Damnation de Faust (Berlioz), L'arbore di Diana (Soler), La traviata (Verdi), Falstaff (Verdi), Die Fledermaus (Strauss), Don Giovanni (Mozart), Romeo and Juliet (Gounod), La bohème (Leoncavallo), and The Cunning Little Vixen (Janáček). Mr. Major has worked for numerous companies including, Opera Theatre of St. Louis, Wolf Trap Opera, Central City Opera, Michigan Opera Theatre, Cape Town Opera, Berkshire Opera Festival, Opera Omaha and Odyssey Opera. In August 2012 Mr. Major began as Chair of Opera Studies at the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston after completing 20 years on the faculty of the University of Michigan where he oversaw the Opera Program, both teaching and directing. From 2003-2014 Joshua Major was the Artistic Director of the Pine Mountain Music Festival, located in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan on the shores of Lake Superior where he produced over 300 concerts of opera, symphony and chamber music. He continues to be a stage director and faculty member with the International Vocal Arts Institute, where he has directed annually since 1993. An advocate for new work, Mr. Major has workshopped operas in progress including works by composers Mark Adamo, Paola Prestini, Scott Wheeler, Julian Wachner and Bright Sheng.

BROOKE STANTON - Costume Designer

Brooke Stanton is a costumer who has worked in theatre, film, and television. During her five years with George Lucas' ILM, she built creatures for the *Star Wars* Special Edition Trilogy and *The Phantom Menace*. She has toured internationally and nationally designing for Peter Sellars. Other clients include Disney, Columbia Pictures, CBS, American Repertory Theatre, American Conservatory Theatre, Aspen Music Festival, Berkshire Opera Festival, Boston Symphony Youth Orchestra, Commonwealth Shakespeare, Santa Fe Opera, S.F. Shakespeare, New England Conservatory, and Odyssey Opera. She costumed three films with Robin Williams after studying Costume Design at NYU and Textiles at California College of the Arts. She is currently the Director of Costumes at Brandeis University.

ROBERT TWETEN - Musical Director and Conductor

Robert Tweten has performed extensively as both a pianist and conductor throughout the USA and his native Canada. He currently holds the positions of Head of Music Staff for The Santa Fe Opera, and Music Director of Graduate Opera Studies for New England Conservatory, where he provides musical guidance for the Graduate Opera Studies Program. The position, Head of Music Staff, was created by The Santa Fe Opera for Robert in 2000. He has been on the podium for a number of productions during his tenure at Santa Fe, most recently conducting performances of Falstaff during the 2022 season. Tweten has enjoyed a long relationship with Utah Opera/Symphony where he has conducted eighteen productions since his debut in 2005, and other companies he has collaborated with include the Lyric Opera of Chicago, Calgary Opera, Vancouver Opera, Florentine Opera, Opera San Antonio, Kentucky Opera, Edmonton Opera, Dayton Opera, Austin Lyric Opera, Tulsa Opera and Sarasota Opera. Tweten's recent projects have included orchestral concerts with the Santa Fe Pro Musica Orchestra, as well as leading The (R)evolution of Steve Jobs and La bohème for Utah Opera, and the North American premiere of Roberto Scarcella Perino's Furiosus at Merkin Hall in New York. Productions this season include returning to USUO to lead Sweeney Todd, and conducting Rigoletto for Pacific Opera Victoria. Equally at home as a pianist, Robert has performed throughout the world with many of the industry's most prominent singers, and presently is Music Director for the Sag Harbor Song Festival, and Performance Santa Fe's Festival of Song.
