Frederick Etude Book I – Trichord Studies

I - Break

This etude is a study of the saxophone's 'break—the half-step shift from C# to D, where the player moves from an open fingering to a closed one.

II - Cycle

This etude focuses on harmonic development through cycles of voice leading using the axis of contextual inversion.

III - Scalar

This etude involves quick, scalar movements, ascending through Messiaen's 5th mode of limited transposition.
